Word from the President and the General Director

We are pleased to present our organization's results for the 2025-2026 financial year. Despite an economic climate still marked by uncertainty, this year's results once again highlight the vitality and resilience of our islands.

SADC des Îles invested \$2,048,000 in the form of loans to support 22 local businesses, thereby contributing to the creation or maintenance of 201 jobs. These results are comparable to those of the previous fiscal year. Over a ten-year period, this represents an average annual investment of \$1,671,795. Once again, business succession remained a key priority, with 50 % of the total financing granted, while business start-ups represented 14 % of investments.


We would like to highlight the success of our dedicated funds, particularly the Transfer Strategy, which has proven to be an excellent complement to our Business Succession Fund and Alternative Youth Fund. Important drivers of economic development, these two funds have supported 113 business transfers since 2007 and 110 youth-led business projects since 2017. Their flexibility allows them to adapt to the realities of each business and to a wide variety of financial structures.

Beyond financing, our team assisted nearly 50 entrepreneurs this year and delivered 25 training activities.


Our SADC also remains a key contributor to major community development initiatives. Our close collaboration with the Réseau intégré de communications électroniques des Îles (RICEIM), which manages the island's two essential fiber optic submarine cables, is a strong example of our commitment to local infrastructure.

This year's achievements are the result of the expertise and dedication of an outstanding team. We extend our sincere gratitude to our employees, volunteers (mentors and administrators), as well as to the entrepreneurs and partners who actively participate in the economic development of the islands. Our gratitude also goes to Canada Economic Development, our main partner, and to the Réseau des SADC et CAE du Québec, for their support.

By working together, we are building the economic future of our community. We look ahead to the coming year with the same energy, and determination. Thank you all for your continued trust and support.

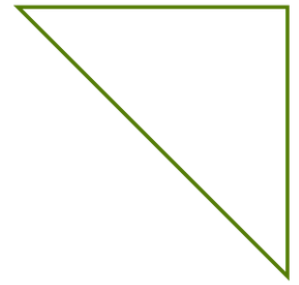

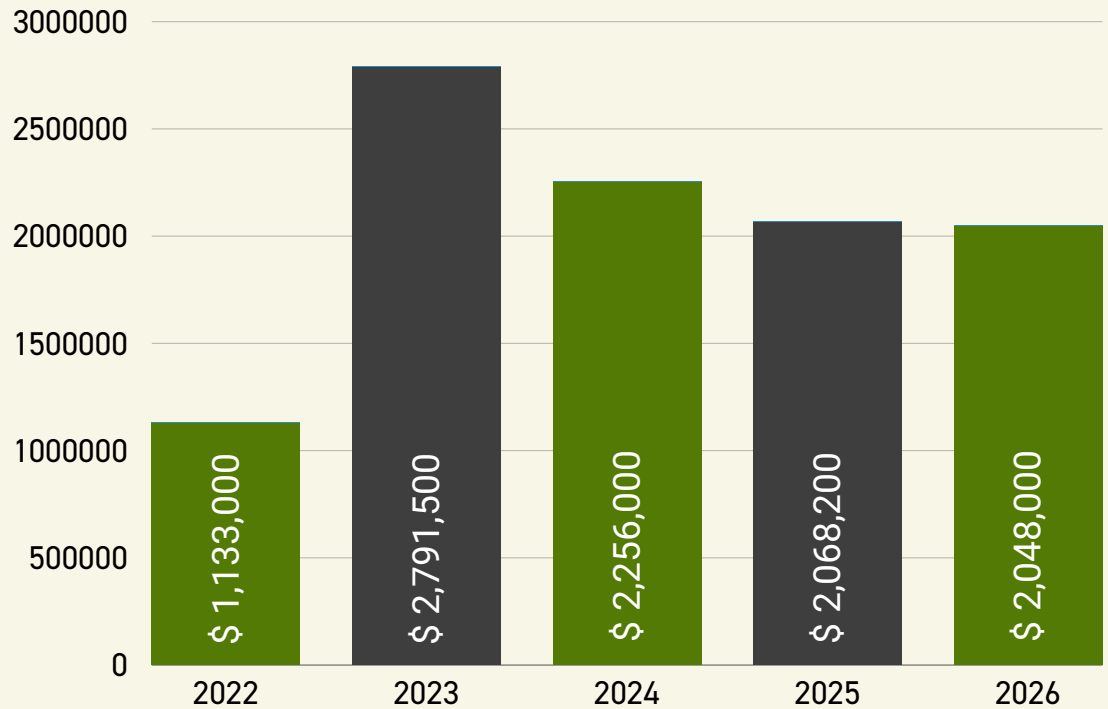

Evolution of investments over the last 5 years





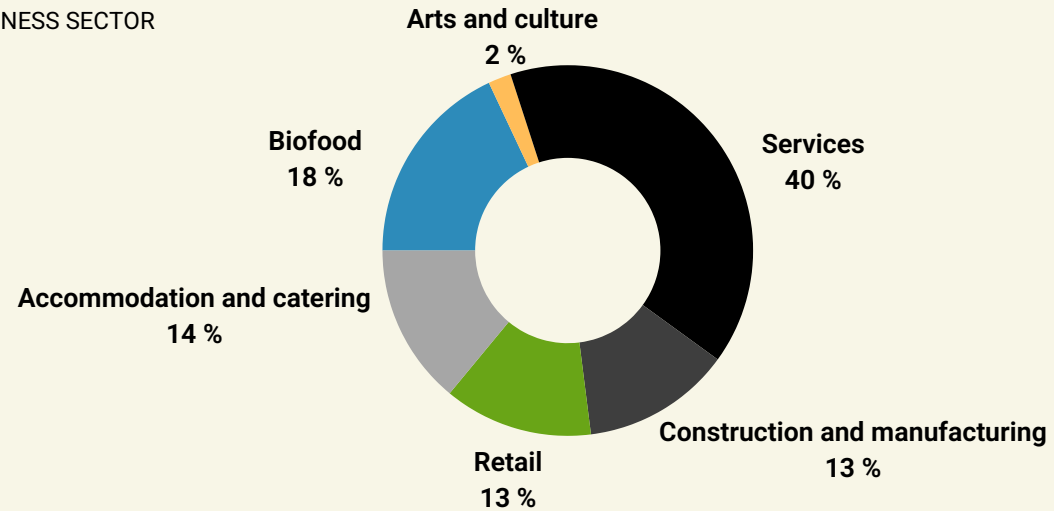

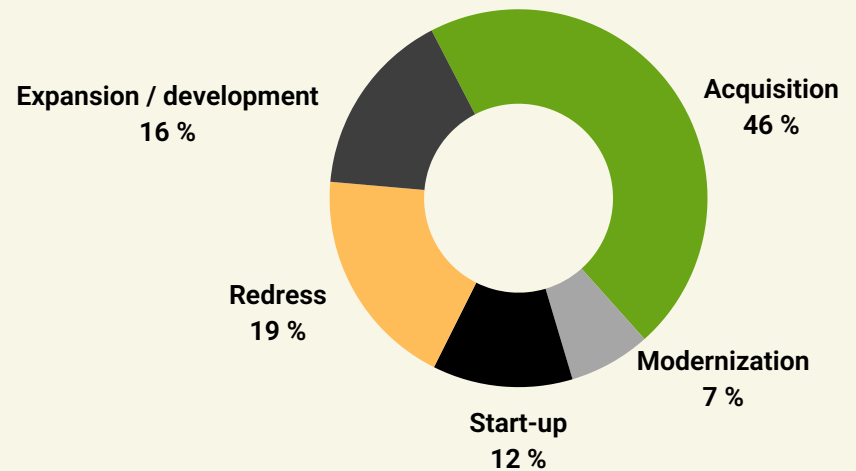

BY PROJECT TYPE

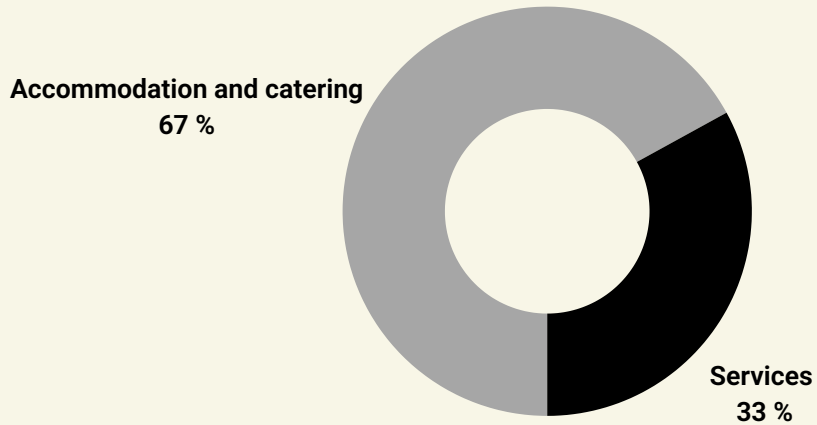
